Course Prerequisites

- Hold a rated CAANZ Part 66 Aircraft Maintenance Engineers Licence (AMEL) in both Aeroplane and Powerplant categories, or in both Rotorcraft and Powerplant categories; or in all Electrical group 1 and Instrument group 1,2 and radio group 1,2,3 categories; or
- 2. Hold an equivalent CASA Part 66 AMEL that is registered in NZ, as per CAR 66.203(1).

To have an IA Certificate issued you will need to meet the experience requirements of CAR 66.203(1)(ii), i.e. 5 years.

Notes:

- Gliding New Zealand (GNZ) Engineers are not required to meet these CAANZ prerequisites, please refer to GNZ <u>Manual of Approved Procedures</u> (MOAP) for IA-G eligibility and general requirements.
- 2. Applications to complete this course are accepted from maintenance engineers seeking this training for CAR Part 145 Maintenance Organisation company authorisation issue.
- 3. CASA PNG do not accept this course for initial issue of a CASA PNG Part 66 Certificate of IA.
- 4. Course number is limited to 12 people for examination purposes.

IA Certificate Issue eligibility requirements – Rule 66.203

- Hold a current rated NZ Part 66 AMEL in both Aeroplane and Powerplant categories, or in both Rotorcraft and Powerplant categories; or in all Electrical group 1 and Instrument group 1,2 and Radio group 1,2,3 categories, or
- 2. Hold an equivalent CASA AMEL registered with CAA, and
- 3. Have held a current AME Licence for a minimum period of 5 years, and
- 4. Successfully completed an IA Initial Course and Subject 025 examination.
- **NB:** Current means you meet the recent experience requirements of CAR Part 66.57
